



Respecting Our Referees

This document outlines the expected standards of behavior towards referees in accordance with the U.S. Soccer Referee Abuse Prevention policy, as adopted by AYSO.

Referees are essential to the game and deserve to be treated with respect. We are all responsible for helping kids have fun playing soccer, and taking anger out on referees negatively impacts everyone and the future of soccer.

Key Principles

- Respect the Call: The call on the field stands.
- Protecting Our Referees: We are committed to ensuring the emotional and physical well-being of our referees.
- No Physical Abuse: There is never a reason to touch a referee outside of friendly handshakes.

VERBAL ABUSE: Verbal abuse occurs when dissent is taken to an extreme, public and personal level.

Levels of Unacceptable Verbal Behavior

The following outlines different levels of *verbal* abuse against referees:

- LEVEL 1: VERBAL TAUNTING
This includes insulting, belittling, insinuating, or taunting behavior that undermines referee authority.
- LEVEL 2: HARASSMENT/INTIMIDATION
This includes harassment, intimidation, retaliation, abusive or threatening language.
- LEVEL 3: THREATS/DEROGATORY LANGUAGE
This involves aggression, attacking, derogatory, cyberbullying, doxing, or threatening (physical/violence) language.
- LEVEL 4: OFFENSIVE OR DISCRIMINATORY ACT
This includes discriminatory or derogatory words or actions based on race, skin color, ethnicity, nationality, social origin, gender, disability, sexual orientation, language, or religion.

PHYSICAL ABUSE: There is never a reason to touch a referee outside of friendly handshakes.

Levels of Unacceptable Physical Behavior

The following outlines different levels of *physical* abuse against referees:

- **LEVEL 1: MINOR OR SLIGHT DELIBERATE TOUCHING**
This includes tapping the referee's shoulder, touching the referee's chest, intentionally bumping the referee, or pulling on the referee's jersey.
- **LEVEL 2: INTENTIONAL CONFRONTATION**
This involves pushing, grabbing, pulling, squeezing, pinching, lightly slapping, use of an object in a non-striking manner, or physical property damage.
- **LEVEL 3: VIOLENT CONTACT**
This includes hitting, punching, elbowing, kicking, biting, spitting, chocking, tackling, throwing or use of object, or any part of the body in a striking manner.

CONSEQUENCES

The Penalties Matrix from U.S. Soccer defines consequences (sanctions) for non-physical and physical abuse against Referees.
